Course(s): Bachelor of Professional Accounting
Core Unit: Elective
Credit Points: 10 credit points
Study Period: Year Three

Study Load: Students should expect to spend approximately 130 hours on studying and completing assignments across the study period. Unit Description:

This unit provides experience and supervision in a significant case study project conducted within accounting and/or management fields. Students will work in groups of four, in conjunction with the unit coordinator, on their specific case study project to emulate the real-world business scenario. The emphasis of this unit is on the application of case study knowledge gained in other units as well as developed in this unit for the documentation of a project with input from all members of the group, culminating in presentations at a seminar of their peers and academic staff.
